Jesus stood alongside the Sea of Galilee and told his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer greatly and be killed. Peter pulled Jesus aside and began to rebuke him, telling Jesus that such a thing should never happen to him. And Jesus said to Peter, “Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle to me. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do.” (Mt. 16:23)

In my opinion a lot of people in this nation and world think not as God does but as human beings do. This is especially evident in the discussion of gay marriage.

Many times I have been told that that’s how God made them—to be gay. And because of that they should be allowed to be happy, to have a best friend and soul mate, to have a family, to grow old together and to have the same rights as straight people do. Who could argue with that? I could.

I admit I don’t know many gay people but the gay people I have met are top-notch people. They are dedicated and caring, funny, hard-working, and have treated me with kindness. Why wouldn’t I want them to experience the joy of marriage? I wouldn’t—if I thought as human beings do. My calling, our calling, though, is to think as God does.

How does God think? Well, the Word of the Lord, the Bible, begins with a marriage between Adam and Eve. Shortly thereafter they are told to be fruitful and multiply and are reminded that a man leaves father and mother and clings to his wife, and the two of them become one flesh. (Gen 2:24) Jesus repeats this teaching and concludes that “what God has joined together, no human being must separate. (Mt. 19:6). Throughout Scripture the covenant between God and humanity is described in marital terms, “As a bridegroom rejoices in his bride, so shall your God rejoice in you, (Is 62:5) and “The Lord has established his reign, our God, the almighty. Let us rejoice and be glad and give him glory. For the wedding Day of the Lamb has come, his bride has made herself ready. (Rev. 19:7) The Word of the Lord lets us know what God thinks.

But God didn’t quit “thinking” once the Bible was finished. Always, the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son to enlighten the people of God baptized into the Body of Christ, the Church. We as Catholics can be very proud that our Church continues to strive ardently to learn the Truth. Our theologians spend years studying to help us learn the ways of God, often at great personal sacrifice. Why? So that we can use the knowledge they share to move beyond thinking as humans do. The Catechism of the Catholic Church helps us. It says, “God is love and in himself he lives a mystery of personal loving communion. Creating the human race in his own image God inscribed in the humanity of man and woman the vocation, and thus the capacity and responsibility, of love and communion” (ccc 2331). Theologian Christopher West puts it this way, “A man’s body doesn’t make sense by itself. Nor does a woman’s body. But seen in light of each other, sexual difference reveals the unmistakable plan of God that man and woman are meant to be ‘gift’ to one another.”

I agree with that. Unmistakable. God didn’t make a mistake when he ordained that a man and a woman should join together as one flesh. The mistake is made by those who think that God did or, worse, that it doesn’t matter what God thinks. Well, Jesus has something to say about that, “Get behind me, Satan.”

This weekend we celebrate our Independence, our freedom. However, the Supreme Court decision has me worried about our freedom of religion. More on that next week.

MSGR. FORST'S WISDOM

On June 29, 1921, I was born at 1725 Del Norte, Richmond Heights, MO. In those days the births took place at home with the assistance of a mid-wife, Mrs. Newnhaus. I was the first one to be born in our "new house." I was baptized on July 3, 1921 by Father Joseph McMahan at St. Luke's. At the time, the Church was in a building in which the Church was on one floor, and the school on another. As time went on the school population grew and the whole building was needed for educating the children. To help the parish grow, a permanent Church was built. It was a wonderful building, skillfully designed; built of cut limestone and is happily used to this day. It certainly is a worthy House of the Lord. There, the family received the other sacraments that make for the completion of a person of faith. To make a long story short, I graduated from St. Luke School. At that time I began my way to the priesthood at the Cathedral Latin School. It was a two year high school located at 4244 Washington in St. Louis. From there I went to what is now called Kenrick-Glennon Seminary. The final years of preparation for the priesthood were at "The Real Kenrick" which is now called the Rigali Center. I was ordained priest on December 21, 1945 and I hope to have a grand celebration on or near December 21, 2015. It has been a wonderful life and I hope and pray that God continues to bless me with good health and strong faith in the active priesthood here at St. Mark.
