from the Pastors Pen

After observation, thought and prayer I have decided not to reinstate the 7:30 am Monday-Friday Mass when the school year begins in two weeks. I know this may present a burden to some of you and I am sorry for that. We have not had the 7:30 Mass since the beginning of July and everybody seems to have adjusted to the current schedule. By not offering a third Mass every morning Msgr. Forst and I will be able to offer Mass at other places. For the past couple of years both of us (and when he was here, Fr. Olsen) have travelled at least once a week to Our Mother of Good Counsel Home in North County to say either the 6:00 am Mass for the nuns or the 9:30 am Mass for the residents. Until two weeks ago, my mother was in this Home and Msgr. Forst has a sister who still lives there. Additionally, this is the place where our priests are sent when they become infirm. Currently, seven of our archdiocesan brother priests live there. Beyond the nursing home, it is becoming more difficult for priests who serve alone in a parish to find help. Not having the third Mass at St. Mark's may allow us to go to another parish so the people can have Mass when their pastor is gone.

It is nice to be able to help others who need a priest but even here at St. Mark's there are extra Masses to pray. This parish has at least 50 funerals every year so just having two Masses will allow me to concentrate on the Funeral Mass.

Finally, when Lent arrives next year I would like to offer the 5:30 pm weekday Mass for our parishioners and our neighbors from other parishes. This 5:30 Mass draws a good crowd during the important Lenten Season. I'd like to keep that tradition without adding too much of a burden on our priests.

On behalf of my brothers and sisters and our extended family I want to thank all of you who offered prayers and support to us on the death of my mother. The parish staff went above and beyond. The musicians and choir did a beautiful job in enhancing the Funeral Liturgy. So many people prepared delicious food and many worked hours to serve it. Our family was touched by your generosity and comforted by your compassion. On a personal level, I appreciate your words of sympathy, your promise of prayers, the cards you sent, the Masses for my mom that you arranged, and the effort you made to come to the wake and/or funeral. My family was blessed by your goodness at the end of 2010 when my father died so we knew we could rely on the people of St. Mark's again and you didn't let us down. Thank you.

I will be leaving tomorrow with my brother Mike to visit our uncle at his monastery in Utah. For more than 50 years my uncle, Fr. Brendan, served at a monastery in Iowa but his order, the Trappists, asked him to help at their tiny monastery, only 8 monks, in Utah. So, Mike and I will travel there tomorrow and come back Friday. Pray for our safe journey and know that I will be praying for you.

MSGR. FORST'S POTPOURRI

If one wants to give the impression that they can “speak in tongues” one needs to know that some sayings might backfire. Others can be an expression of great joy. For example, the Greek word “eureka”, (“I have found it.”), is a word that tells of the great joy of finding something lost. On the other hand I remember the homely wisdom of Fr. Donovan who taught in the “real” Kenrick seminary. He made this timely statement needed for certain occasions—“Mental paupers have no alms to give.” One must be careful, even though it can be true, as a fair weather friendship might be lost. On the other hand, it can serve a purpose. There is another saying that might backfire—“When you die you will go straight to heaven.” The implication is obvious, but the results might be a disaster.

Speaking of a sacred matter, there is a **very, very great need** for a dress code for church worshipers. To say, “Well, at least they are here” is not acceptable. Bodily presence hardly ever “fits the bill.” For example, usually in the Springtime of the year, students make great preparations for Prom. For sure the dress code is an absolute that is violated only by fools. They are usually ostracized by all. When it comes to celebrating the sacred mysteries in Church it seems “anything goes.” Some even look like they are going to a swim party. “Well, at least they are there.” No go. The celebrating priest and Altar Servers are dressed in fitting vestments. The worshipers should do likewise. “Verbum sapienti est sufficiens.” Or, a word to the wise is sufficient. “At least they are there,” doesn’t “cut the mustard”.

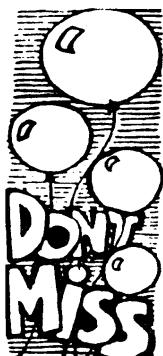
