**Pastor's Desk**

O God, who brought St. Louis from the cares of earthly rule to the glory of heavenly realm, grant, we pray, through his intercession, that, by fulfilling our duties on earth, we may seek out your eternal Kingdom, through Christ our Lord....

By special permission of Archbishop Carlson, we transfer the Feast of St. Louis from August 25<sup>th</sup> to today. We remember with affection the patron saint of this city and archdiocese. We recall with admiration his devotion to his wife, Margaret, and their 11 children. Eager to imitate, we think of his dedication to the poor, of how St. Louis invited the poor to his own dinner table and did not allow his servants to place food before them, but instead did it himself. We think, too, of his enthusiasm for education, of the schools he founded, and of his love of architecture and the many churches and hospitals he had erected.

St. Louis possessed an indefatigable energy for life and directed that energy in many directions so as to serve many people. But never was his passion so intense or his love so focused than when he was at prayer. Here was a man who adored God. Here was a man who relished the opportunity to be in God's presence, particularly when at Mass. Allow me to quote again the words of St. Louis to his son, Philip, "Dear son, I advise you that you listen willingly and devoutly to the services of Holy Church, and, when you are in church, avoid frivolity and trifling, and do not look here and there, but pray to God with lips and hearts alike, while entertaining sweet thoughts about Him, and especially at the Mass, when the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ are consecrated....."

Do you know what St. Louis was doing while he was doing all these things? The Opening Prayer of today's Mass gives us the answer. He was fulfilling his duties on earth. Saints like Louis view the world like that. They see what is before them—a family, a vocation, a poor person, a fellow sinner, a chance to serve—and remember that they have a duty, to God and His people, to do something, whether it be to love or forgive or help. Let us ask St. Louis to truly intercede for those of us under his patronage, that we, like him, will fulfill the duties that God gives to us and one day join St. Louis in the eternal Kingdom.

It has been a while since I wrote anything about our future move, and, as you might expect, it is because nothing much has happened. Finally, though, the archdiocese has given permission to the architects to actually design something. I am scheduled to meet with the architects on Thursday, the 20<sup>th</sup>, three days from when I am writing this column. I'll let you know what I find out and I pray that no complications surface as we finally begin to see substantial plans.

I thank those of you who generously donated to the missions in response to the homily of Maryknoll Missionary Fr. Tom Tiscornia. Father asked me to express his gratitude for the welcome you gave him and for the money you gave. Your contribution will bring much happiness to a missionary of our Church and allow him or her to bring the Gospel to those who hunger for the Good News. Thank you.

St. Louis, our Patron, pray for us!  
May God bless all of you.
