## WE LONG TO SEE GOD'S FACE

"Lord, this is the people that longs to see your face." This antiphon for today's responsorial psalm offers the focus for today's readings. As we on earth celebrate the triumph of all the saints—the ones officially canonized by the Church, and the countless others who have also reached heaven—we add nothing to their glory. But we give ourselves reason to hope. We too long to see the face of God and believe that we can one day be counted among those whose robes, as John tells us in the book of Revelation, are washed "white in the blood of the Lamb."

The passage from John's First Letter offers further assurance: we are God's children who will one day see God. But today's Gospel pulls us past longing and reassurance into action. Jesus clearly tells us what we must do to be counted among the saints. We must be poor in spirit, hungry for holiness, merciful, single-hearted, and peacemakers! Then we too will see the face of God.

**A word from \_\_\_\_\_** Our final report of the 2015 Fall Festival has been completed and our Fall Festival Committee has presented to the parish a check for \$32,200. St. Mark Parish is truly thankful for this money as it will help us meet our financial obligations. The 2015 Fall Festival was the twelfth one and our parish has received \$406,906 in income. This money has been used to help our parish children get a good education, or allowed us to purchase things necessary for Mass, like hosts, wine and candles, or heat or cool our buildings. All these things are important and all of them have been accomplished with the help of our Fall Festivals.

Two more things, just in case you were wondering. How did this year's Festival compare with previous ones? Our previous Festivals averaged around \$35,000 in net profit so this year's numbers were down a bit. Second, some have asked where will the 2016 Fall Festival be held? Good question. If I had to bet, I would bet that it will be in its current location. At the rate things are going I don't think our move to the school property will be completed by next September. Personally, I'd like to get one more year on this property because it is a wonderful spot to have this event.

Again, I offer my deepest gratitude to all who made the Fall Festival a success. Especially to our Core Committee. All of you were terrific.

Allow me to print again the following words which come from an anonymous source:

Faith is not merely praying upon our knees at night.

Faith is not merely straying through darkness into night.

Faith is the brave endeavor, the splendid enterprise, the strength to serve whatever conditions may arise.

Such words beautifully describe the women and men we esteem on this All Saints Day. What a marvelous example they give us for they brilliantly embraced "the brave endeavor, the splendid enterprise." Let us pray this day that we, too, will be eager and honored to get in that line of heroes—saints—that march into Paradise. May we, with great enthusiasm, follow their example of dedication to the will of God and simultaneously leave an example for those who come behind us.

Finally, please accept my invitation to come to Mass tomorrow night at 7:00 pm to celebrate All Souls Day. Many at the Mass will be relatives and friends of those who have had their funerals at St. Mark's in the past year. Your presence and prayers for these faithful departed will be appreciated.

### FROM THE DESK OF MSGR. FORST

A proper dress code has been the subject of "From the Desk of Msgr. Forst" on many occasions. It occurred to me that some people may not know the names of the garments the priests and Altar Servers wear for Mass. An alb is the white vestment worn by priests, deacons and servers. It is simply a large baptismal gown worn by these ministers to remind them of their baptism. A cincture is a long cord used as a liturgical belt. It is a reminder of our call to live holy lives. Priests and deacons are normally not seen wearing them. Sometimes the cincture is built into the alb and fastens with Velcro. That is it for the Altar Servers, be they boys or girls. A stole is a long piece of cloth worn by a priest or a deacon. A priest wears it over his neck with both ends hanging down in front. A deacon wears his in a diagonal across his chest. The stole is a sign of office and power that comes from that office. For example, a priest stole symbolizes the power given to them by Christ to forgive sins and consecrate the Eucharist. A chasuble is the large outer garment worn by a priest. It symbolizes love and thus, for the most part, is worn over the stole because a priest should only exercise his power through love like Jesus did. Perhaps more to come another day.
