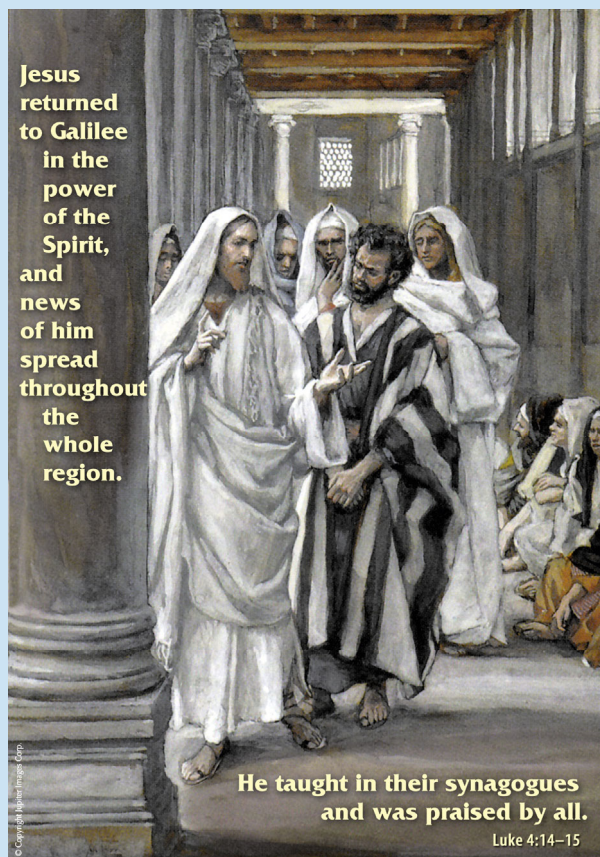


LIVING AS THE BODY OF CHRIST

 **DEAR PARISH** ...

Though I didn't want any prior publicity today's Coffee & Donuts is doubling as an acknowledgement of my 30th anniversary of priestly ordination, which actually occurred last month. I am grateful to all who arranged today's breakfast offerings and, more so, to God, who called me to this wonderful vocation and, as He did for Jesus, made sure "the Spirit of the Lord came upon me."

The idea of being a priest had been in my mind since I was in Kindergarten but it took me until I was 22 to finally figure it out and take the steps necessary to enter the seminary. Prayer was the key. I at last came to the realization that God was not going to write the invitation across the sky. I needed to converse with Him, to ask Him and seek God's guidance. Once I did my part and prayed God made it easy for me and I applied to the seminary. God has continued to hear my prayers and has allowed me through the priesthood to be part of extraordinary moments of grace that have through times of joy and sorrow, of happiness and pain embraced me with His Love. God has been good to me.

I must admit that I owe part of my vocation to the prayers of others. My parents and grandparents prayed diligently to God that one or more of my family enter the religious life. Prayers for me specifically continued even during those times in my life when I expressed little interest in the priesthood. My family saw something in me that I didn't see in myself and they beseeched God to reveal it to me. God did.

That's why I repeat again my plea that all of you pray for the young men and women in your family to seek a calling to the priesthood and religious life. And keep praying even if your son, daughter, grandchild, niece or nephew says he/she has no interest in such a vocation. If you see in them something special, something that would make them a good priest or nun, then keep asking God to reveal His will to them. The religious vocation is a fantastic calling and one day your relative will thank you for your prayers.

I thank you for being the good people that you are and for making St. Mark's and St. Andrew's great places to be. I am thrilled and honored to serve you and I thank God that He has called me to do so. I thank, too, our St. Mark School PTO for hosting last weekend's Trivia Night. It was a huge success and they did a tremendous job.

As you read this our young parishioners are making their way home from Washington, D.C., where they participated in the Pro-Life March. Ask God to keep them safe.
