You know that United States Supreme Court Justice Antonin Scalia died last week. Many forms of media already spout ideas on the legacy of Justice Scalia and on when and whom the President should appoint to succeed him. You may have noticed, too, that Justice Scalia was a devout Catholic and with his wife had a family of nine children. But did you know that one of those children is a Catholic priest?

Fr. Paul Scalia is a priest of the Diocese of Arlington, Virginia. Unsurprisingly, he wrote once an article comparing church to a courtroom, an article entitled *Courting Reverence*. In part Father wrote,

"You may not have recognized Sean Combs or Marshall Bruce Mathers III as they appeared for their court dates recently. The irony is, their fans would not have recognized them either. Mr. Combs aka Puffy or Puff Daddy and Mr. Mathers aka Eminem or Slim Shady are giants in the world of rap music. They both have enormously successful careers carefully established on a "bad boy" rebel image. In fact, Mr. Combs is CEO of Bad Boy Entertainment.

But for court they departed from their regular image and behavior. Gone were the baseball caps, sunglasses, gold chains, leather jackets, t-shirts and baggy jeans so familiar in the rap music crowd. Each of them wore a nice new suit and a sharp tie. They did not have the defiant, violent, in-your-face attitude that their music carries and that they display on stage. Rather, they sat still and respectfully in the courtroom as everyone else does.

The courtroom is a place of serious business: it is where life and death issues are decided, where a man's future hangs in the balance, where fortunes are won or lost, debts are settled, and guilt is bound or loosed. Even though the "proceedings" of church conduct a "business" infinitely more important than any courtroom's, people have no sense of it. They do not realize that the Mass makes present the victory of life over death, and gives us our inheritance as children of God. Granted, unlike court proceedings, the Mass does not determine guilt or innocence but instead celebrates and communicates reconciliation. Further, at Mass we approach God not only as supplicants but also and even more as children. Nonetheless, the Mass (and Confession, Eucharistic Adoration, etc.) deals with forgiveness and punishment, with innocence and guilt, with eternal salvation and damnation. That is the most serious business. If in doubt, we can always ask Puff Daddy and Slim Shady."

Serious business, indeed. Like what happens during Lent. A time for sacred, and perhaps difficult, consideration about our life, faith, sins and hopes. Certainly, it was serious business when God had Abraham slaughter those animals and then walk between them in today's First Reading. A terrifying darkness enveloped Abraham, yet through it he was able to understand God's commitment to a promise.

It's serious business in the Gospel, too. Jesus does not appear transfigured with Moses and Elijah for mere frivolity. Salvation is on the way and Jesus, along with Peter, James and John, will use this mountaintop experience as a source of power and strength.

We should, also, and we will as we meditate on "forgiveness and punishment, with innocence and guilt, with eternal salvation and damnation." Lent is our time for serious business.

It is with sadness that I inform you that for personal reasons Jane Brown, opa, is no longer working for St. Mark's. Jane has been at our parish since our beginning and she worked at St. Timothy Church before that. She has been a great asset to me and through her ministry has brought many closer to Christ, especially through the R.C.I.A., Parish School of Religion, Vacation Bible School, CRHP retreats, and the music ministry. She will be missed. Please join me in thanking God for her work here and asking God to bless her always.

From the Desk of Msgr. Forst

The Eucharistic celebration is our great and precious jewel. No other gift of Jesus is as great. In it (the Mass) Jesus speaks to us in the Word and He feeds us with His Body and Blood. He sends us out to live the gospel in the real world not so much by word but by mighty deeds. Shortly before the reception of communion we all pray the Lord's prayer. This is taken directly from the Sermon on the Mount (Chapters 5, 6 & 7 in Matthew). This is placed before the reception of the Body and Blood for a reason. We are to be ready and free from great sin and at peace with our neighbors. ("Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."). Please do not put this off. I have seen this when some have not been reconciled and bitter tears follow. However, in praying I have seen folks holding their hands high. That is all well and good but the priest does that for us. In the ancient Church and to this day the healthy would bring into the celebration the sick as the priest brought Communion to those unable to be present. Sometimes one would see the priest walking to the sick in close neighborhoods. He would be carrying it close to his heart. On other occasions the priest was accompanied by two Altar Boys holding lighted candles. Of course this usually cannot happen in the real world today. What does happen seems to me to border on the sacrilegious. The minister going to the sick receives, then has the priest put a host in the pyx (container used for carrying communion to the sick) and puts it in his or her pocket or purse (bag) or places the pyx nearby for a later time to go to the sick. For sure, on occasion, there is the exception to the rule. In the meantime, rejoice and be glad that Jesus has given us this wonderful gift. No other Church is so highly blessed.
