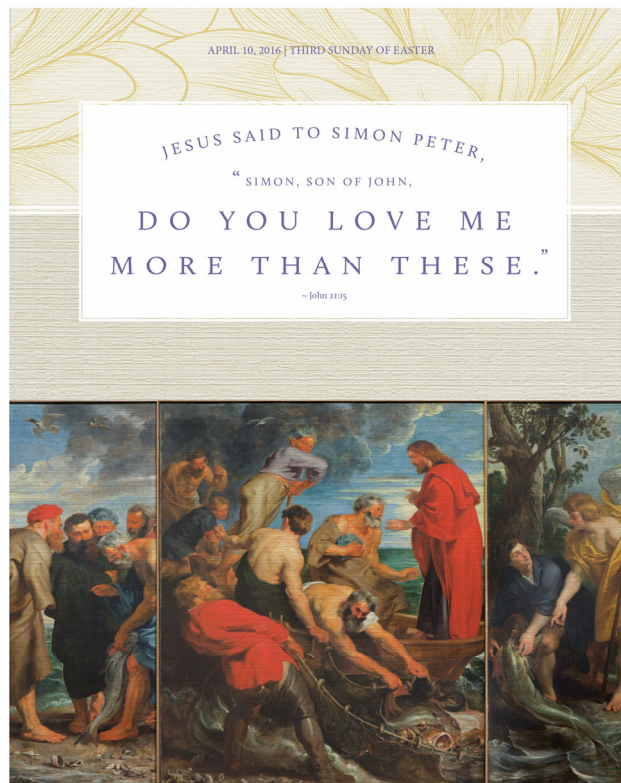


REDEMPTION

Do you remember Peter on the night Jesus was arrested? He claimed he had never heard of Jesus. Today we are called to join Peter in testifying to the name of Jesus as he does in the first reading, and in proclaiming our love for him as Peter does in the Gospel passage. The powerful imagery of John's vision in the second reading from the book of Revelation shows us the company we keep when we have faith in the name of Jesus. We join all living creatures, "countless in number" from "heaven, earth, under the earth, in the sea; everything in the universe" (Revelation 5:11, 13). The dignity and majesty described in each reading are in stark contrast to the dark and pitiful image of Peter and the other apostles at the time of Jesus' arrest, trial, and crucifixion.

What a relief that we can all be redeemed so completely!

from the Pastors Pen

There is a story of little orphan Joe. Joe went to be examined by a doctor and the doctor noted that the little guy had more problems than a youngster his age should have. "Joe," he said as kindly as he could, "you're pretty messed up." Joe went back to the orphanage and reported what the doctor had said, including the "you're messed up" line. Then Joe added, "But, Sister, I don't think he knew I had made my First Communion."

This beautiful Sacrament gives so much to us, including value. We don't struggle to win love or respect. The Lord loves us so much — even when we're messed up — that He invites us to a Eucharistic meal where we encounter communion and fellowship with Jesus Christ.

Today we celebrate with our 2nd grade parishioners as they receive their First Holy Communion. What a great day for them and their families as these children advance to a new and special relationship with Christ, to a level they've never been before. Partakers in an extraordinary meal. Now they sit with Christ at the grown-up's table. Good for them!

I write this on a Monday morning and I know our 2nd graders have been counting down the days until this day, their First Communion Day. As of this writing they have 6 days to go. Let me ask you if you did that. Did you say to yourself, or anyone, last Monday that you only had 6 days to go until you could receive Communion again? Did your excitement build throughout the week as Sunday neared? Did your level of anticipation equal that of our First Communicants as you eagerly looked forward to receiving the Eucharist today? It should have, right?

That's one of the challenges of our faith. We are called to maintain a deep, spiritual intensity at all times as we consider what our Savior has done for us and as we await His presence to us in the Sacraments, especially Holy Communion. Our buoyant 2nd graders will discover that soon enough. Work, hard spiritual work, is required to stay at a high level of spirituality. Let's pray for them on their First Communion Day that they will never lose their enthusiasm for Christ and instead value the fellowship found in the Bread of Life. May everyone know about them that they have made their First Communion. May they know the same about us, too.

May God bless our First Communicants and all of you.

From the Desk of Msgr. Forst

This morning, Monday, April 4, 2016, I was surprised and delighted. It is a day to celebrate the Annunciation of The Lord. It is a big feast with a **Gloria** and a **Creed**. It is usually celebrated on the 25th of March, but since Easter was early this year, this very important feast was transferred to April 4th. While it is called the Annunciation of The Lord, it is more precisely a feast to honor The Blessed Mother. In the Liturgy of the Word taken from Isaiah the prophet and the gospel of Luke, we learn of the Virgin Birth made possible by the power of the Holy Spirit. Today the Mass at 8:15 in the school chapel was a real joy for all. To me it seemed like the people were really “with it” as we belted out the hymn “Hail Holy Queen” as an entrance hymn and “Hail Mary, Gentle Woman” as the recessional hymn. It was a truly fitting celebration to honor Mary, the Mother of Jesus. Also remember that St. Augustine said that “singing is twice praying.” Then when one who prays the Liturgy of The Hours—priests and others — psalm 95 is first — “Come let us sing to the Lord and shout with joy to the Rock who saves us.”

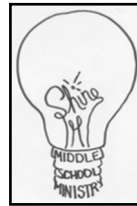
