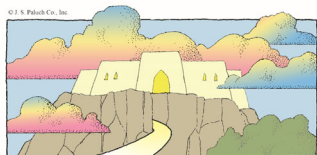

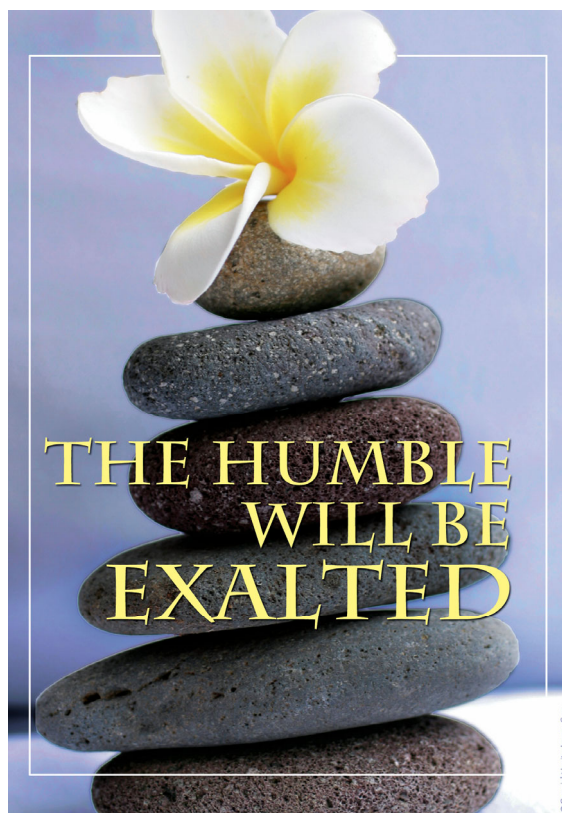

HUMILITY

Have you ever been in a group of people—maybe on a tour, at a social gathering, or at church—and discovered that you have just been talking with a well-known author, corporate CEO, great scholar, or politician? Your first thought is the hope that you didn't say anything to embarrass yourself; but your second thought is how much they seemed like such "regular" folks. What is it that makes people seem so "regular"? Today's readings give us a clue when they stress the importance of humility. It is so hard for us not to tell the first person who will listen how busy we are, how hard we work, how much money we donate, and how important our job titles are. We think these accolades make a difference to people, and if we don't tell them, how will they ever know? But if our actions demonstrate our values, people will recognize our worth on their own. The words of Jesus show us how much better it is to let someone else recognize our worth than to be embarrassed because someone did not.

Last week I invited some parishioners to enjoy coffee and donuts after the 9:00 Mass while their fellow parishioners and I spoke to them about the *Beyond Sunday* campaign. In the course of the Q and A part of the agenda some parishioners asked if St. Mark's was going to have another campaign to pay for the renovations at the school property after we finish the *Beyond Sunday* campaign. Apparently, a number of people in the parish think this is the case. It is not. St. Mark's will receive \$2 million from the Archdiocese along with the money we garner from the sale of Grasso Field, expected to be between \$1.1 and \$1.3 million. That will be enough money to pay for all the renovations. It probably will not be enough to pay for the installation of new wiring for phones and computers or to bring the school cafeteria up to code. My hope is that the parish will be able to pay for those things with the money the Archdiocese will kickback to us from *Beyond Sunday*. We will receive back 40% of what we donate to *Beyond Sunday*.

In light of the importance of this campaign I ask you to pray the following prayer. May God bless our endeavor:

God our Father, in this moment of need we place ourselves with confidence in Your holy presence.

We thank You that in Baptism You made us Your children, redeemed by Jesus Your Son and united to Him and one another. Guide us with the Holy Spirit and deepen the faith we have inherited from past generations. May our efforts be worthy of their memory.

Grant, Lord that the Beyond Sunday campaign will, through support of Catholic education and the parishes of our Archdiocese, bring us, Your people, to new depths of knowledge and love for You. May this campaign be a source of new strength to those in need, of healing in our civic community, of vitality in families, of development for parishes and neighborhoods.

May all who promote this campaign by their prayers, sacrifices and labor be granted a special share in that communion of love that is Yours with Jesus Your Son and the Holy Spirit. We ask this in Jesus' name.

Entrance Procession Catastrophe-Sunday, August 21.

All is ready for the celebration of the 11:00 Mass. As we approach the altar singing with joy I tried to genuflect. This was a mini disaster. In a matter of seconds I was on my back and Annie Buganski, who is a nurse, was telling me what to do. My mind was made up. The Mass must go on. Msgr. Hambrough joined me as a concelebrant. From there all went well as usual. However, Diane Little said, "We are going to the ER after Mass," which we did. Also Paul Hayden was an important person in this most unusual situation. He knew of my need to have my wallet which was left at St. Agnes. He went and got it and brought it to me at St. Luke's hospital. I cannot speak enough praise for all people involved in this unscheduled disaster ~ Diane Little, Anne Buganski, Paul Hayden, the personnel at St. Luke's ER. The very special good news is that even though there was a bump on the back of my head all is well. One of the attendants at St. Luke's asked me this question, "Are you really 95?" I told him that I was in my 96th year. Of course, as I went home I was delighted that the fall was not serious. There were about 300 witnesses and I wonder how many stories will come out of this. My great joy will be to be welcomed again for the celebration of the Eucharist at St. Mark.

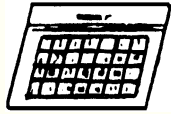

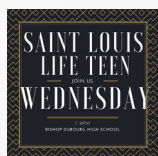

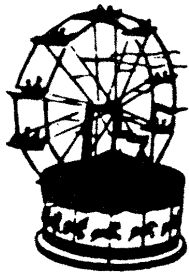
